1. **Bimal Adhikari Award in Applied GIS**- demonstrates technical and/or applied use of GIS for a specific problem or task.
2. **Janos Boda Award in Research GIS**- demonstrate use of GIS within a larger research project.

Submission Requirements

- Must include or be based on a significant GIS or geospatial component.
- Completed or significantly modified within one year of the time of submission.
- Students must either reside, attend school, or complete their project within Manitoba.
- Projects can only be submitted once, unless significant modification occurs.
- Formats can include: project, paper, report, poster or interactive media
- If submission is a poster, it must be no larger than 48 inches by 36 inches.
- If submission is digital a link (to a storymap, website or other online storage media) must be included.
- Papers/reports and other written documents should be no longer than 15-25 pages in length (written pages only, figures, images, etc. don't factor into the page total).
- The submitted work must contain the student's name and academic affiliation.
- In situations where multiple people participated in the project all names/affiliations must appear on the submission.
- Lastly, a statement as to the context in which the work was conducted (classroom project, summer internship, thesis) should be included along with the name of the supervisor.
- Winning submissions will be published on the MGUG website and announced at the MGUG AGM & Winter Workshop (February 22nd 2023).

Submissions will be judged by a panel of GIS professionals for innovation, creativity, communication, and applicability to achieve project results. Winners will be contacted around February 15th. The winners will be announced at the MGUG Annual General Meeting in February 2023 and published on the MGUG.CA website. Winners may be invited to present at the workshop.
